

# SWEB DEVELOPMENT'S PROPOSED HILLVALE COMMUNITY SOLAR PROJECT CUSTOMER SUBSCRIPTION PROCESS

## WHAT is the Hillvale Community Solar Project?

The proposed development is a **~4.95 MW solar energy project** that will be applied to the **Nova Scotia Community Solar Program**, which is run by the Department of Natural Resources and Renewables.

The electricity generated from a community solar garden goes into Nova Scotia's main electricity grid to help power buildings, homes, and appliances of participating subscribers.

## WHERE is it located?

The proposed project is located on private land on Ardoise School Road, west of Highway 202.

## HOW does the subscription process work?

Community solar garden subscribers are people and organizations who sign up to get their electricity from a community solar garden. **You can subscribe to a community solar garden if you are:**

- A current Nova Scotia Power (NSP) customer in good standing, and;
- Not participating in any other solar programs with Nova Scotia Power, including net-metering.

Subscribers can choose to offset their electricity usage from **10% to 100%**.

When applying, NSP will **review your past annual electricity use and expected annual electricity use to determine the maximum number of kilowatt hours solar electricity can offset**. NSP begins applying credits to your account the month after you become a subscriber.

**Solar garden subscribers receive a \$0.02/kWh discount on their electricity bills.**
