- **Woodstock First Nation (WFN)** is part of the Wolastoqey Nation located north of Fredericton, NB, slightly south of the town of Woodstock along the Saint John River (traditionally known as the Wolastookwiuk River). The WFN community has developed businesses that focus on the sale of fuels, commercial logging, local fisheries, and gaming. They've collaborated with SWEB Energy in the past with the 18 MW Wisokolamson Energy Project in Riverside-Albert, New Brunswick which is currently providing annual bursaries to the WFN community to support the pursuit of post-secondary education amongst its community members.
